# Chapter 10: Memory Assignment Due: Fri March 16, 2018

For this assignment you have a choice: Option A or Option B. You will have 6 classes with the COW to do your research and write your paper. If you need more time, then you will need to complete it at home. Whichever option you choose, I expect your submission to be of Grade 12 quality. I suggest that you get a friend to help you edit your writing. I will not accept rough drafts.

You will submit your assignment as a pdf or word file via your ePortfolio on your Unit 2 page, under the heading "Memory Assignment".

## Option A

Read a book, watch a movie/tv show that references some aspect (topic) about memory. It can be something that you have already read/watched. See the list on the back of this page for possible topics about memory.

- → In a 2 page paper (about 500 words, double spaced), you will include the following elements in separate paragraphs:
- 1. You will define your topic, explain what it is, how it is caused & treated, symptoms, techniques...whatever is appropriate to your topic. If you are unsure what you should be researching, ask me. You will have to do some research for this, be sure to cite appropriately.
- 2. You will summarize the plot, and detail how your chosen topic is portrayed in the story. How does it affect the character/plot? How does it make the character/story different?
- 3. You will critique the application of the topic in the movie. Was it portrayed accurately? Refer to evidence in the story **AND** research (APA citations people!), when you do this.

I recommend you follow the 5 paragraph essay format introduced in class. You must cite **at least 3 credible sources** both within the text of your paper and in the References page. In-text citations are probably new to you; ask for help if you need it. Yes, your media source (movie, book, tv show) can count as one of your references.

\*\*If you want to watch a documentary instead of a fictional movie, that's ok, but see me for guidance on what you will need to include in your essay.

<u>Some book ideas</u>: Still Alice, Before I go to Sleep, Elizabeth is Missing, Remember Me? The Maze Runner.

<u>Some movie ideas</u>: Memento, Total Recall, The Bourne Identity, The Vow, 50 first dates, Before I go to Sleep, The Long Kiss Goodnight etc. **NOT INSIDE OUT** 

<u>Some TV episode/character ideas:</u> Dr. Reid in Criminal Minds, Black Mirror, Blindspot, Unforgettable, Buffy the Vampire Slayer (Season 6, episode 8)

### Option B

Choose a topic or vocabulary term that has interested you in this short chapter. I've include a list of vocabulary words below, but you are not limited to these. If you have another term, or topic related to memory that you would prefer to investigate – great! Just run it by me first, please.

→ You will research this topic. In a 2 page paper (about 500 words, double spaced) you will include the following elements in separate paragraphs:

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1. You will define your topic, explain what it is, how it is caused & treated, symptoms, techniques...whatever is appropriate to your topic. If you are unsure what you should be researching, ask me. Be sure to cite appropriately.

- 2. You will discuss experiments or current research that has been done on your topic. Be sure to include who conducted the research (which university etc), when, how and the findings.
- 3. You will tell why you topic is relevant to learning about Memory.

Please use the 5 paragraph essay format introduced in class. You must cite **at least 3 credible sources** both within the text of your paper and in the References page. In-text citations are probably new to you; ask for help if you need it.
